# Upfront

If cooking is not my favorite thing, it's a close second or third. I love every aspect of it. The obsession operates well beyond the bounds of the kitchen: Thinking about what I want to make; shopping for ingredients; changing my plan depending on the surprises that inspire me at the store; unpacking and storing stuff when I get home; deciding upon the perfect pot, pan and process; creating a mental time line for each dish; slicing, dicing and chopping...all culminating in the ACTUAL thing – the “cooking,” which is a relatively easy step in the sequence, its success or failure an affirmation or rejection of the decisions leading to it. Then, there's the eating part. Ecstasy (often, in my case, far too fleeting). Reward for work well done.

I speak through food. It accesses a lexicon that eludes my spoken voice. I convey caring and emotion in bite-sized bits, unable to do so as effectively with words. At least, I hope it works that way.

Holidays, then, are conspicuous opportunities to declare affection with a baked good or braise. A cookie's crumble catching on your kid's sweater, trace evidence of your heart's sweet truth. In my family, we're in the phase where each of three generations seeks to employ a form of culinary communication. But there is only so much a person can eat.

Reluctantly, my mother has ceded some hosting duties to me over the years. In turn, my girls have methodically, little by little, year by year, seized increasing control of our menus and meal prep. Initially, I was resistant: “Too many cooks in the kitchen...” and all that. For me, cooking is undemocratic. Like interior design, someone in the family must make the decisions. Egalitarian collaboration is a naïve ideal. The kitchen is an autocrat's natural domain. The dining room allows for broader participation, though it's limited to sharing the spoils after the battle has been won.

A few days ago, my daughters suggested, via our ongoing group text, Christmas dinner at my house. (I'm tempted to type “our” where you read “my,” as each of them still has her intact bedroom on the fourth floor, though the existence of their apartments dictates the proper pronoun choice.) As to my home as our special-meal venue: Great idea. They (my kids) informed Grammy, who would consent to an unnecessary amputation if either of the girls asked. Exclamation points filled our screens as Grammy (my mom) confirmed her delight. With a subsequent caveat, of course: “I'll bring the...”

I must be getting old. Or mellow. Or resigned to natural evolution. Or all three. Rather than suggesting a multi-course banquet befitting of my personal tastes, I volunteered to make one thing. “You guys do all of the sides and desserts.” It worked at Thanksgiving – this segmentation - it seems we have a tenable division of labor figured out. “I'll make a seafood stew,” a nod to the Italian-American experience. Consistent with her predilection for candor, Sofia said, “Sure, but maybe not seafood stew...”

So, I'll produce the perfect rib roast, even though Gabby's a vegan. Actually, mushroom risotto, as a nod to inclusivity, might be a more prudent choice. Likely truth: Both. And the girls will bring more than half a dozen of their best ideas to the table, literally. Used pots will fill the sink and disappear and fill it again, as predictable as the tides. Spots of edible dirt will pepper the floor. My mother and father will both, independent of one another despite a very narrow window of opportunity, chastise me for eating too fast. We'll all complain that we're uncomfortably full.

This is what love looks, smells, feels and tastes like. This is how we say the things we'd rather not. Mangia! Buon appetito! I'll see you in the 2022.

# Two Wayward Histories

## JINGLE BELLS AND JAMES LORD PIERPONT

It's sometimes said that ministers' kids are poorly behaved. This axiomatic stereotype fits James Lord Pierpont, the son of a Unitarian minister, John Pierpont, Sr. And if a clergyman's son with a checkered past had happened to write music, then maybe his song "Jingle Bells" – more accurately: "One Horse Open Sleigh" – would have been troubled, too.

First, the song. Troup Square in downtown Savannah boasts the "Jingle Bells Church," a Unitarian Universalist house of worship. Tour guides will tell you James Lord Pierpont, a church musician, came south from Massachusetts to serve the congregation led by his brother, John Pierpont, Jr. In 1857, missing the snowy climate of his native New England, James penned a song about racing sleighs.

However, Savannah's claim is challenged by a rival story from Medford, Massachusetts, where John Sr. preached the Unitarian faith (and a robust dose of abolitionism) to New England's elite. Medford history buffs claim that the younger Pierpont penned the popular song seven years earlier, in 1850, in the city's Simpson Tavern. The historical marker documenting the claim reads, rather defensively, that the song was created "in the presence of Mrs. Otis Waterman, who later verified that the song was written here." Further compounding the conflict between claimants of the song's provenance: Boston University researcher Kyna Hamill has pointed out that James wasn't in Massachusetts in 1850, rather he was residing in faraway California.


Savannah's claim is bolstered by the song's publication date of 1857. Historians logically point out that Pierpont would be unlikely to let seven years pass – not to mention a move to Savannah – before publishing a song in Boston, which was the center of American publishing in the 19th century, that he'd written in Massachusetts in the first place. But Medford can claim the setting of "Jingle Bells" over comparatively balmy Savannah. "One Horse Open Sleigh," a winter tune rather than a Christmas one, recounts sleigh rides and races, activities familiar to wintry Medford.

The themes within "One Horse Open Sleigh" are racier than they might appear at first thought. The well-known verses give way to an extended saga featuring speeding cold-weather conveyances and a high-impact col-

lision, set against the backdrop of youthful indiscretion and hormone-fueled courting. Sleigh rides represented rare opportunities when unmarried couples could find themselves unchaperoned. So, was "Jingle Bells" a church song? No way. Pierpont's plucky admonition to "go it while you're young, take the girls tonight" suggests an additional element of urgency to the already-hasty riders.

More about the composer: Born in 1822, Pierpont was a wayward soul, even in his youth. Feeling stifled by New England breeding and boarding school, he stole away at age 14 to join the crew of a whaling ship. From there, he found his way into the U.S. Navy, but mustered out by age 21 to return to Boston, where he married and, in due time, fathered three children. When the California Gold Rush became national news, he left his family in the care of his father to go west, a journey that found him in California in 1850 when he was allegedly writing his most famous song.

No panning for gold for Pierpont, though. Instead, he owned a photography company, peddling daguerreotypes until he lost his equipment in a fire. He also lost his first wife to illness and death in 1856. Busy at songwriting in both Massachusetts and California, he continued composing when he arrived in Savannah. This is also where



he met his second wife, Eliza Jane Purse, daughter of one of Savannah's best-loved mayors.

How did the relocated brothers from Massachusetts, sons of a staunch Unitarian abolitionist father, adapt to their new home in Savannah, deep in the nascent Confederacy? They joined the locals. It's happy lore for Unitarians to boast that their spiritual ancestors were run out of town for their vocally moral views against slavery. Yet Unitarian church member John Iaderosa has discovered in letters from John, Jr. to his father an unmistakable softening regarding slavery. Perhaps Pierpont began to think slavery wasn't quite the evil he once believed. And James? He joined the Confederacy at the start of the Civil War, making a permanent home in the South, where he composed songs for the cause with titles like "Strike for the South" and "Our Battle Flag!"

Even Pierpont's non-military songwriting espoused 19th-century racist tropes. His minstrel compositions were frequently performed by white men in black face. "One Horse Open Sleigh" was dedicated to John Ordway, a Boston-area physician, composer and leader of a singing troupe, Ordway's Aeolians. A Boston playbill dated "September 1857," revealed that "One Horse" was sung by a performer named Johnny Pell, one of Ordway's "dandy darkies."

A plaque on both your houses: Despite evidence suggesting Pierpont wrote "Jingle Bells" in Savannah, the city of Medford, Massachusetts, disputes the claim as the song's birthplace. Both locations have compelling arguments in their favor.

At Savannah's Unitarian Universalist Church, Iaderosa recently delivered a lay sermon on racial justice in which he mentioned the church's "Jingle Bells" connections. "If Medford wants this dubious claim to fame, then they can certainly have it back," he said, indicating his aversion to the troubling history.

Reverend Susan Karlson admitted that she once freely identified the church with its "Jingle Bells" fame, if only for ease of directions. "I don't do that anymore," she says.

This year's caroling service in Troup Square will not proclaim the association. Karlson acknowledges, "This song is a piece of the story long associated with our church." But like Iaderosa, she'd happily let Medford claim the song's birthright. Since local lore persists, though, she would prefer that "the entire story be told. For me, it's a matter of the mission of the church in its pursuit of social and racial justice."

Murky provenance and racist overtones notwithstanding, "Jingle Bells" has wooed the world. It outranks "My Old Kentucky Home," "The Stars and Stripes Forever," and "Georgia on My Mind" on list after list of all-time musical favorites. It has been recorded and re-recorded by artists from Herb Alpert to Julie Andrews, from Count Basie to The Beatles, from Dinah Shore to Kate Smith, and from James Taylor to the Three Stooges. Reaching far beyond Western culture, the catchy holiday song seems to be a particularly popular melody in Asia.

"Jingle Bells" has even slipped the atmospheric bonds of earth to become the first song ever broadcast from space. Astronauts on the 1965 Gemini mission scripted and delivered via radio a Yuletide parody of a Santa sighting which culminated in their improvised performance of "Jingle Bells," played on harmonica and tiny sleigh bells.

# AMERICAN UNDERDOG

## IN MORE WAYS THAN ONE

I think he was four the first time I saw him. He had an extendable cane longer than he was tall. His eyes were mostly closed. His black hair was cropped short, sticking up in a few spots. He scrunched his cheeks until they overwhelmed his little nose. Though he was blind, as he remains today, he didn't seem to miss a thing.

Hayden (nee Dan-dan, pronounced like "don") had just arrived from China, along with his preternaturally muscular two-year-old adoptive brother whom he had met only days before – Kai. It would be months before Kai would surrender his first unselfconscious smile. Hayden, on the other hand, was a people person from the minute he touched down on American soil. The boys' new mother and father, Shannon and Mike Zaller, had traveled halfway round the world to a pair of orphanages to introduce themselves in a tongue their new sons couldn't yet understand. When Mom and Dad pulled up to the curb in front of the garden apartment one door west of my house, they suddenly doubled their brood. Constance, the oldest of the four and smart as a whip, and Lucca, wide-eyed, curly-haired and working to develop her verbal skills, ran from Grandma's lap and up three steps to the sidewalk and their new brothers and a world that would never be the same as it had been.

From the start, I adored these kids...all four of them. My burdens disappear every time I pass them on the street. Each visit is filled with unfiltered joy. And I, as do many, marvel, as I have from the first day the boys showed up, at their parents' capacity for kindness and love.

Quicker than you'd imagine possible, Hayden offered English phrases that perfectly matched their intent. Kai was a more frugal language patron. He communicated fearlessly with his small-but-strong arms and legs. Once Kai warmed up to me, a form of wrestling became the currency of our bond. Hayden had a knack for matching footfalls to their makers, and he was soon calling to me as we silently approached one another from opposite ends of the street. Constance and Lucca handled the testosterone invasion as well as could be hoped. The attention they received was instantaneously halved, no matter the attempts to compensate from their inner circle. The reduction was simply an arithmetic truth. The divisor had doubled from two to four. There were occasional spats and subsequent tears. But, mostly, there was the curing foundation that now supports the most exceptional family I know.

The boys have been here for (I'm guessing) five or six years now. To my chagrin, the family moved to California for a year. Thankfully, they came back. While they were there, they met Lucy. Like Hayden, Lucy is blind. About two years ago, Lucy learned of a film that was in its early development stage. A biopic about the overachieving Hall of Fame quarterback, Kurt Warner, a father of seven, including a blind boy whom he adopted when he married the boy's mom. Lucy had heard that the movie's producers intended to cast an authentically blind child instead of asking a sighted kid to play one. Lucy contacted

Shannon, and the family set off on an unlikely path.

On Christmas day, Lionsgate Films' *American Underdog* opens in theaters coast to coast. It stars Dennis Quaid, Zachary Levi, Academy Award winner Anna Paquin, and an impressive ensemble, including Savannah's Hayden Zaller, as Warner's son Zack Warner. Amazing, but not inexplicable, as the Zallers are performers. Mom and Dad are long-time principals in the resident Savannah Theatre cast. Each of the four children grace the theater's stage during a typical production year. Occasionally, Grandma works the concession stand when she not helping care for the kids.

Shannon explains the process that landed Hayden on the big screen. "We sent in Hayden's initial audition - we videoed him doing the script, which he had to memorize because they didn't have a copy available in Braille - the first week of March of 2020. We didn't hear much about it after the country shut down; but, by Thanksgiving, we were contacted for a second audition and a director interview. We were in Tennessee for a funeral at the time, so Mike and Hayden just plopped down on the vintage couch at Mike's Grandpa's house and did some of the scenes." Evidently, Mike and Hayden did well, as shortly thereafter Hayden got the part.

The idea of being in a movie is mind-blowing. The reality is more sobering. Hayden had a hard time being away from his siblings for two months. Because of COVID protocols, the family wasn't allowed to visit the set. Shannon says, "We were lucky to have Anna Paquin (she plays Brenda Warner), who had her family in town with her while she filmed. She has two kids close to Hayden's age, and that

really helped with the heartache. They welcomed Hayden into their games and dinners and never made him feel less than. And now he has friends for life."

Meanwhile, there were three other kids in the house. Three kids with real feelings and a brother who had gone from his shared bedroom to a motion picture set. Kay says, "I was happy for Hayden to be in his first movie, and I hoped he did good as a son in the film." Lucca volunteers a candid reaction: "I was sad. Happy for Hayden, but I felt very jealous. And Constance, befitting an equally endearing and non-plussed tween-queen, adds nonchalantly, "I felt sad and bored."

How does the budding star feel about his work? "It's very nice –

acting. It's challenging to try to say the words to make it sound like you came up with it on your own. The director (Andy Erwin) helped me with that." It seems he has the acting bug. "I'm hoping that more people, whenever they write movies, will write another one for blind people. Because I want to be in it."

Things take time to get used to. So it goes for sharing a sink with a SAG member. But the Zaller kids came around. Ever-wise Constance explains, "Our relationships (among the family) became stronger."

Still, Lucca never quite accepted Hayden's extended stay way. "It was sad because he's our most loving and most kindest guy." According to the younger girl, there's a silver lining to the separation. "Me and Daddy got along better. Me and Constance had a few fights, but we still get along."

And Kai recognizes that his reaction to Hayden's star turn might have been problematic at first. "I was a little mean. And then I started to be nice."

Hayden has been blind from birth. Which is intriguing in the context of discussion of

a visual medium, like film. I asked Shannon about this. She says, "Hayden's blindness doesn't stop him from enjoying movies, especially with the added descriptive audio features that are now in films and tv shows. (For blind audiences) there is a voice actor who describes all the important visual cues and effects that happen onscreen when an actor isn't speaking."

What would a film set be without a bit of gossip? According to Hayden, Zachary Levi loves to make people laugh and Anna Paquin gives the best hugs. Director Andy Erwin was an instant favorite. Erwin, along with director of photography Kris Kimlin made sure Hayden always felt safe and comfortable.

Can a mother make an objective critic? I asked Shannon to try. She says, "The film is great for everyone, even people who don't know a thing about football. There is a love story, and the relationship between Kurt and Brenda and Zack. I think that people will realize, as they leave the theater, that not only have they witnessed Kurt's underdog story that is well known and loved, but they also are witnessing Hayden's underdog story playing out in real time."



## PHYSICIAN SPOTLIGHT

### DR. RUSSELL KIRKS

*This Savannah native brings his specialty in liver, pancreas and bile duct surgery to the Coastal Empire*

#### Why did you decide to become a doctor?

I couldn't decide on what to do towards the end of high school and ended up spending some time with some emergency room providers. I thought the pace of what they did was interesting, as well as the breadth of what they saw and treated. But then, from shadowing some surgeons, I thought surgery was super interesting and decided that's what I wanted to pursue.

#### How would you describe hepatobiliary and what are some conditions you treat?

Hepatobiliary and pancreatic surgery is treating benign and malignant problems of the liver, pancreas and bile duct. These can be things people are born with, things that happen from injuries or other surgeries, cancers, or the long-term effect of other diseases. What makes hepatobiliary surgery different from something like surgical oncology is that we also include problems like chronic pancreatitis, bad gallstone disease – those two things, specifically – but we also treat malignant conditions of the liver, pancreas and bile duct. Instead of just focusing on the surgical procedures themselves, what the extra training provides is knowing when it's appropriate to do surgery, how to optimize people for an operation, and how to collaborate with other specialties such as gastroenterology, interventional radiology and medical oncology to come up with the best treatment plans for patients with these problems.

#### How did you pick this specific specialty?

Reading through all the different surgery textbooks as a student, I thought that some of these problems were the most interesting in terms of the interplay between anatomy and physiology and results, and what could not only structurally but medically and functionally be done to correct them. When I was a medical student, I was lucky to see some of the major hepatobiliary operations like a bile duct exploration to remove stones from the bile duct and a Whipple operation. I was fascinated with the idea of liver molding, or the strategies we have to modify the liver in order to change its shape so that we can remove advanced tumors. As an example, we can induce part of the liver to grow so that another portion can be removed along with a tumor. The liver is a pretty remarkable organ in that it regenerates pound for pound whatever is cut out. That allows us to tailor our operation to the exact problem of the patient. It was this interesting anatomy and physiology and its interplay that attracted me to the field.

#### Why do you think it's important to offer this specialty to patients in the Savannah region?

I've known Dr. (T. Ellis) Barnes and Dr. (John) Odom for a long time. Speaking with Dr. Odom, I learned that many patients with hepatobiliary problems were being referred to Atlanta, Charleston, Jacksonville or farther away to be seen by a surgeon and potentially have surgery. That can create headaches if you need to see a surgeon for a problem, and when you're away from family for the procedure. It's comforting just knowing that there is a system and someone close to home who can help whatever occurs in or around the time of surgery should a complication occur.

Especially for people who don't have the means to travel for four hours one way or be without family on a regular basis, I saw the opportunity to extend these services to people in my hometown.

#### What common procedures do you perform?

I do gallbladder and bile duct surgeries for bad gallstone disease. I also perform liver resections for things like liver tumors that start in the liver or metastasize to the liver. I

do procedures like the Whipple Operation, which is the removal of the head of the pancreas, the bile duct, the gallbladder and typically the bottom third of the stomach and then creating connections to drain those organs back into the intestinal tract. It's typically a cancer operation. I also perform the distal pancreatectomy where the left-sided half of the pancreas is removed. These are typically more involved and complex operations to resect these organs. We are doing other things here such as liver resections and liver ablations using microwave energy to cook liver tumors inside without having to do a liver resection. Depending on which operation, it's either going to be an open operation, a laparoscopic operation or a robotic operation, depending on the patient, the tumor location, and other technical requirements.

#### How has technology impacted your specialty?

For the field – especially for liver surgery, but for HPB surgery in general – this is probably one of the most technologically involved fields of general surgery. Tools that we use for most HPB operations include intraoperative ultrasound where I use an ultrasound probe during surgery. This enables me to locate tumors and target them for ablation, see what their relationship is to surrounding vascular structures, or determine if tumors are resectable and examine other parts of the organ to assess disease extent. I also use energy devices to aid in dissection and a microwave ablation device to perform an in-situ ablation of liver tumors.

#### When it comes to our liver and our pancreas, what's some general advice to keep these organs healthy?

For liver health, moderate alcohol intake and maintain a healthy diet. If you have some type of evaluation indicating you have a problem with one of these organs, even something common such as fatty liver disease, it should not be brushed under the table. It should be discussed with your primary care doctor as well as a nutritionist to see if lifestyle changes should be made. Alternatively, if you are having symptoms, such as yellowing of the skin (jaundice) or changes in your bowel habits or abdominal pain that is not getting better, it's not something to ignore. Nobody will ever question a patient for coming forward to evaluate complaints like these. Feel free and safe to talk your providers so that potential problems can be detected early.


