


keyboard, right here, right now.

Congratulations; good luck; enjoy every day, now and always, as they will one day be precious memories if you approach them with proper care.



any Skidaway Island residents are vaguely aware of Kiwanis but I might not know much about the organization, its purpose, activities, or history. We fill in some of those blanks here.

Founded in 1987, Kiwanis of Skidaway currently has 147 members. The group was originally named "Golden K of Skidaway," and was comprised mostly of retired men. Feeling the name discouraged younger people from joining, the group changed its name to the current one during the 1990s. Many current members work full-time.

In the early years, there were very few women, but that is changing quickly. Seventeen women have joined since 2021 - several with their husbands - bringing the female membership to 29. Two past presidents are women, and three women are currently board members. The women bring a great deal of energy, and motherly instincts for caring for children, consistent with the Kiwanis mission.

Kiwanis of Skidaway makes local impact. It serves children of Savannah and Chatham County, spanning causes including at-risk youth, education, healthcare, healthy lifestyles, and mentoring. The club holds several fundraisers each year to raise money and awareness for local agencies that help improve the lives of children. The Landings community has a tradition of generous support for Kiwanis's fundraisers and mission. In 2022, Kiwanis of Skidaway donated more

Kiwanis International was founded in 1915 in Detroit, Michigan, by a group of businessmen. The organization was originally called the Supreme Lodge Benevolent Order of Brothers, but changed its name to Kiwanis a year later. The new name was coined from a Native-American expression, "Nunc Kee-wanis," which means, "We trade." In the early years, members focused on business networking.

to service — to children, specifically. In 1920, the motto of Kiwanis became "We Build." In 2005, members voted to change the motto to

"Serving the children of the world."

In the past 100 years, Kiwanis has grown to international proportions, with clubs in Europe, the South Pacific, Africa, South America, and Asia. There are more than 500 clubs in North America, totaling almost 142,000 members. The Georgia district includes 143 clubs within the state. Kiwanis members represent a wide range of ages, careers, and interests. Many volunteer to work In 1919, the organization changed its focus with agencies supported by Kiwanis and other organizations to help improve the lives of local children in their communities.

than \$120,000 to fund social services, educational programs, protective services, and the general health and wellbeing of children in

In February, the club hosts a pancake breakfast at Skidaway Community Church, which generously offers its space. Kiwanians take care of the setup, cooking, service, and

the cleanup afterward. This year's breakfast was standing-room-only, and additional tables were quickly sourced to handle the overflow crowd.

Kiwanis organizes a chili cook-off in November. Last year's event took place on a gorgeous autumn day. Many people, families, and pets enjoyed the sunshine and tasty chili

samples. Fourteen Savannah restaurants brought gallons of chili to compete for prizes, including "Hottest Chili," "People's Choice," and "Best Presentation" awards in restaurant and community divisions. In addition to the restaurants, the Landings Club dining facilities participate in this event, as well as area banks, brokerage firms, and clubs.

The Kiwanis Flag Program has been a huge success, contributing more than \$55,000 to the club's donation funds. For \$50 a year, Kiwanians will place a base holding two American flags in your yard or hallway on four patriotic holidays: Presidents' Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, and Veterans' Day. You've seen them all over the island; more than 1,200 residents (about a quarter of households) have subscribed to the program.

Kiwanis hosts three Red Cross blood drives each year. Available time slots usually fill to capacity, and record amounts of blood have been donated by the generous residents of Skidaway Island.

Sponsorships are another substantial source of funds, as companies large and small donate annually to Kiwanis. Currently, there are 27 platinum, gold, silver, and bronze sponsors, generating more than \$40,000. These sponsors take active interest in local children and help improve their lives.

If you have an interest in helping children or learning more about our community and enjoying informative presentations and opportunities for fellowship, please join us. Kiwanis of Skidaway meets every Thursday (except Thanksgiving and Christmas) at the Palmetto Club at 7:45 a.m. Meetings end by 9. Guests are always welcome. Kiwanis



GEN. JONATHAN W. WAINWIGHT

HE SERVED BY RON LAURETTI

n September 2, 1945, the battle-ship USS Missouri (BB-63) lay at anchor in Tokyo Bay. Hundreds of men crowded the deck to witness the formal surrender of the Japanese empire, officially ending the hostilities of World War II. Only two Allied military leaders accompanied Gen. Douglas MacArthur, the supreme Allied commander in the Pacific, in receiving the surrender. They were Gen. Arthur E. Percival of the United Kingdom, and Gen. Jonathan M. "Skinny" Wainwright, U.S. Army.

Wainwright was a third generation of his family to serve in uniform – and the only one to outlive his military career. His grandfather, also Jonathan M. Wainwright, was a naval lieutenant killed in action during the Battle of Galveston in 1863. Wainright's father, Robert Powell P. Wainwright, commanded a squadron of the 5th Cavalry at the Battle of Santiago de Cuba during the Spanish-American War. He died in the Philippines in 1902.

Wainwright graduated from West Point in 1906, where he had served as first captain of the corps of cadets. During World War I, he was assistant chief of staff of the 82nd Infantry Division and saw action in France in the Saint-Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne offensives. In 1920, he was promoted to major while most of his fellow officers were discharged due to a downsizing of the military after the war.


During the period between the two world wars, Wainwright served as a cavalry officer. In 1931, he graduated from the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and from the Army War College in 1934. In 1935, he was elected a hereditary companion of the Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States, by right of his grandfather's service in the Union Navy during the Civil War.

In 1938, as dark clouds of war gathered over Europe, Wainwright was promoted to brigadier general in command of the 1st Cavalry Brigade at Fort Clark, Texas. In 1940, he advanced to major general, and rushed to the Philippines to serve as the senior field commander of Filipino and U.S. forces there. When the Japanese invaded the Philippines in December of 1941, Wainright was tasked with leading the resistance. Under his direct command, he had three reserve Filipino divisions and a Filipino scout cavalry regiment, plus a smattering of American troops who had escaped from the Japanese beachhead of Lingayen Gulf. Most American troops had withdrawn to the Bataan Peninsula and Corregidor, defending the entrance to Manila



The Allied situation in the Philippines rapidly deteriorated. When MacArthur evacuated to Australia in March of 1942, Wainwright inherited the unenviable position of Allied commander of the Philippines, and was promoted to the temporary rank of lieutenant general (three stars). At the time, he needed more men and supplies, not stars.

The 70,000 Allied troops on Bataan were




Under the watchful eyes of a Japanese censor, Gen. Jonathan Wainwright ordered Allied forces in the Philippines to surrender.

adequate defense, their commander, Maj. Gen. Edward P. King, was forced to surrender the entire garrison. Four weeks later, the Japanese attacked Corregidor in force, defeating its poorly supplied defenders.

There were still defensive forces on Mindanao but because of a shortage of food, supplies, and ammunition, Wainwright ordered the remaining holdouts to surrender to minimize casualties. Many did, but some joined the guerrilla resistance movement operating in the

By June 9, 1942, all Allied forces in the region, except those who had joined the guerrilla movement, had surrendered. Wainwright was held in prison camps in northern Luzon, Formosa, and Liaoyuan, suffering the same brutal mistreatment as his men despite his prestigious rank. He was overworked, underfed, and physically mistreated. His captors denied him adequate medical treatment. Wainwright shrank to little more than skin and bones.

In August of 1945, after three long, punishing years, he was rescued by the Russian Army. Normally of lean stature, anyway, Wainwright's difficult recovery from near-starvation left him permanently very thin. Hence, the nickname. When MacArthur met the emaciated general in 1945, the Pacific commander-in-chief immediately decided Wainwright should accompany him at the surrender ceremony as an example to the defeated Japanese of American resolve and courage.

As the Japanese delegation boarded their motor launch to depart the Missouri, a formation of American B29 bombers and carrier-based

fighter-bombers soared overhead, displaying American military might in all its glory to the vanquished enemy. As a gesture of victory and a reward for Yankee survival under extreme conditions, MacArthur gave Wainwright one of the five pens he used to sign the Japanese

surrender agreement.

Wainwright's involvement in the Japanese surrender was not quite finished. After participating in the ceremony on the Missouri, he departed for the Philippines to receive the


Gen. Wainwright stands directly behind Gen. MacArthur at the surrender of Japan aboard the

SAVANNAH WIND SYMPHONY Afterward, Wainwright was promoted to four-star general, and **PRESENTS** honored with a tickertape parade in New York City. The humble but courageous general was then awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military award. On September 28, 1945, Wainwright "Let Freedom Ring" was named commander of the 2nd Service Command and the Eastern Defense Command at Fort Jay, Governors Island, New York. Four **PATRIOTIC** months later, he was named the commander of the 4ht Army at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, filling the vacancy left by the recent death of Lt. Concert Gen. Alexander Patch. Wainwright reluctantly ended his Army career on August 31, 1947, when he reached the then-mandatory retirement age of 64. In his honor, the soldiers of the 4th Army performed a precise "eyes right" salute for the old general as they passed in parade revue. In spite of failing health, Wainwright made himself available to speak before veterans' groups up until a few months before his death. He was the perfect example of American patriotism, as his Medal SUNDAY of Honor and the 14 other awards mounted on his dress uniform JULY 2, 2023 GSU ARMSTRONG CAMPUS FINE ARTS AUDITORIUM Wainwright died of a stroke in San Antonio, Texas, on September 2, 1953, at age 70. Attending his funeral service at Arlington National an the QR Code to purchase tickets Cemetery were military greats like Omar Bradley, George Marshall, and Edward King. Wainwright is one of the few people to have their funeral held in the lower level of the Memorial Amphitheater at Ar-

lington, a sacred place of honor.

It leans on the bounty of the season: ripe tomatoes, crab, artichokes, flowering herbs.

Crabmeat is expensive. Unless you're picking your own from your fresh catch, you have three or four choices (in descending order, pricewise): jumbo lump, lump or backfin, and claw. Conventional wisdom is that pricey jumbo lump is the best. Not necessarily. It depends on usage. Claw, in fact, is arguably the most "crabby," flavor-wise, while only half the price of jumbo lump. It's perfect for the pasta here. Rose wine/balsamic vinegar is a hybrid, lighter in color and flavor than pure balsamic and available in local markets. Oregano is exploding in local gardens this year. If you want to add a fourth dessert element to your easy, light meal, offer a bowl of fresh fruit. So simple, so good.

Rose wine/balsamic vinegar Freshly ground black pepper

Slice tomatoes (I prefer thick slices). Arrange on a serving platter. Generously season with salt and pepper. Drizzle with glugs of olive oil. Follow with vinegar. Strip oregano leaves to scatter all over the tomato slices.

1 tbsp celery salt

Bring a large pot of well-salted water to a boil. Submerge artichokes, cover pot, and cook for 45 minutes to 1 hour (stop when leaves begin to conspicuously fall off). Meanwhile, mix the other three ingredients together in a bowl and set aside. When ready, remove and drain artichokes and serve with the dipping sauce.

LINGUINE WITH CRAB

- 1 lb linguine
- 1 bunch spring onions (scallions), coarsely chopped
- 1 lb claw crabmeat
- 1/4 c salted butter

Crushed red pepper flakes

- 1 ½ c Malvasia or other semi-sweet to sweet white or "orange" wine
- 1 28-oz can San Marzano tomatoes, crushed by hand

Melt half the butter over medium heat in a Dutch oven or high-sided saute pan. Add scallions, salt, and cook for 3 to 5 minutes, moving on if they start to brown. Add crab, season with salt and red pepper, stir well. Increase heat to high and add wine. Cook alcohol off for a couple of minutes as wine volume reduces. Add tomatoes, season liberally with salt, bring to a boil, reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer for 10 minutes. Meanwhile, cook pasta in boiling, very salted water. Before dropping drained, cooked pasta into sauce, add the remaining butter and stir into crab mixture to melt. Toss and mix pasta well inside the saucepan.



'Gluten-free' Isn't a Fad, It's a Necessity for Celiac Sufferers

luten-free: It's a phrase that we hear all the time. Ten years ago, the idea was far less familiar than it has become. Some people are wary of the hype, worrying that it means paying more at a grocery store or restaurant.

Yes, gluten-free is a trend. But for patients with celiac disease, it is a way of life. For others, gluten can affect their quality of life, too. So where do you fit into the gluten discussion?

CELIAC DISEASE

William Mansour, MD

William Mansour, MD, of Gastroenterology Consultants of Savannah, PC, treats patients with a variety of gastrointestinal issues, many of which cause similar symptoms - diarrhea, constipation, bloating, or abdominal pain. Other symptoms such as fatigue, weight loss, and iron deficiency anemia could be an indication of celiac disease. Anyone can develop celiac disease, but there is a genetic predisposition in Caucasian populations. It is often found in those with a first-degree relative who has celiac disease. People with type-1 diabetes and other autoimmune disorders are also at risk.

"Celiac disease is an autoimmune disorder, which means the body's defense system attacks an allergen," Mansour explains. "In this case, the allergen is gluten."

Gluten is a protein found in wheat, barley, and rye, and other foods that contain those grains. This includes popular foods and drinks such as pasta, breads, soups, and beer.

"If a person with celiac disease ingests gluten, their body's autoimmune process will start attacking the gastrointestinal tract," Mansour says. "This is what causes the symp-

toms such as diarrhea and bloating. But left untreated, celiac disease can also lead to serious issues such as headaches, depression and anxiety, iron deficiency anemia, and a skin rash called dermatitis herpetiformis."

Lifelong untreated celiac disease can lead to lymphoma in some patients. "This is why a diagnosis of the disease is so important," Mansour says.

If Mansour suspects celiac disease, he will have the patient undergo a blood test to detect the level of tissue transglutaminase, or TTG. This is what starts the autoimmune response. "If your level is higher than normal, we follow that up with an upper endoscopy," Mansour explains. "In this procedure, a long, flexible tube with a tiny camera is guided into the stomach and small intestine. We look at these areas and take biopsies of the small bowel. That is how we get our diagnosis."

STRICT DIET = HEALING

There is no medication or surgery for the treatment of celiac disease. Patients must eliminate gluten from their diets to mitigate symptoms. Doing so can be difficult, but there is no other effective treatment.

"We are going to have to change your diet," Mansour says, emphatically. "Otherwise, serious conditions, including cancer, can happen in the long run."

Often, the relief from gastrointestinal distress is enough of a motivator for patients. "It's tough and it's strict," Mansour says of a gluten-free lifestyle. "Especially for younger people who realize they can't have pizza, they can't have a beer. But overall, my patients are very receptive to it. Most people are willing to try anything to be free from these symptoms."

The basic diet eliminates anything made with wheat, barley, or rye. These ingredients can sometimes be in unexpected places such as sauces, salad dressings, or chicken with breading. If a patient tries to go gluten-free

but still experiences symptoms, Mansour will refer them to a registered dietitian nutritionist at St. Joseph's/Candler.

"The multi-disciplinary approach with me and the nutritionist helps the patient be truly gluten-free and stick with it," Mansour says. "The nutritionists help patients hammer down where the obstacles might be. And then, as the small bowel begins to heal itself, they will notice the change."

NON-CELIAC GLUTEN SENSITIVITY

If Mansour rules out celiac disease but you still notice gastrointestinal symptoms after eating foods with gluten, you may have a non-celiac gluten sensitivity. There is confusion between the two conditions, but the essential difference is that non-celiac gluten sensitivity isn't caused by the autoimmune process. Non-celiac gluten sensitivity will not lead to more serious disease in the way that celiac disease can, if left untreated. And the solution is the same, but less strict: Avoid foods with gluten. If you really can't give up

pasta night, you don't have to. Just be aware that the consequences are gastrointestinal symptoms like bloating, diarrhea, and constipation.

Some proponents of the gluten-free diet claim it will increase your energy and help you lose weight, but there's no evidence of these benefits. In fact, some food manufacturers sell gluten-free baked goods such as brownies or muffins but will add sugar to retain flavor. At the same time, the marketing for these products might give consumers the idea that they are choosing a healthier option.

A correct diagnosis is essential. "Celiac disease mimics a lot of other gastrointestinal issues, so we have to take great care to make sure it is not missed," concludes Mansour. "But you could simply have a sensitivity to gluten, which won't lead to the same systemic effects of celiac disease. We can diagnose what is happening and help you make the choices that are best for you."




CLASS OF 2023
